What do Cub Scouts get up to?

There are loads of fun things that you can do as a Cub Scout.

You will get a chance to try lots of different activities like swimming, music, exploring, computing and collecting.

If you do them properly you will get a badge which you can wear on your uniform. Some of the badges are shown on this page.

Cub Scouts also get to go on trips and days out, to places like the zoo, theme parks or a farm.

Sometimes you will be able to go camping with the rest of your Pack. This will mean you sleeping in a tent and doing loads of outdoor activities.

As a Cub Scout you will:

- have a lot of fun
- try lots of new things
- play games
- make friends
- explore the outdoors
- have adventures

The most important part of being a Cub Scout is joining in with other members of the Pack and gaining Challenge Badges.

Joining-in Awards



These are special badges that are awarded every year.

The numbering indicates how many years you have taken part in scouting activities, starting from the time from when they first joined.

There are also a number of other special awards and optional badges that you can gain.

Challenge Awards

There are seven Challenge Awards, these are:

- The Outdoor Challenge
- The Promise Challenge
- The Creative Challenge
- The Fitness Challenge
- The Global Challenge
- The Community Challenge
- The Outdoor Plus Challenge



These badges offer a variety of activities so that you can develop your personal interests and skills.

It is possible for someone to attempt a Challenge Award more than once. However, if this is the case, a greater effort is expected the second time around.

Chief Scout's Silver Award



This is the highest Award in the Cub Scout Section. It is gained by completing:

- the Outdoor Challenge, plus
- the Promise Challenge, plus
- the Creative Challenge, plus
- the Fitness Challenge, plus
- the Global Challenge, plus
- the Community Challenge

If you have not quite completed the requirements for this award before moving on to the Scouts, then you can complete it when you start in the Scout Troop.

Partnership Awards

These are undertaken by a number of Sections working together. For example, the Cub Scout Pack working with the Scout Troop, the Beaver Scout Colony or the local Explorer Scout Unit.

The Awards are:

- The International Award
- The Environment Award
- The Faith Award



Cub Scout Moving-on Award



The Moving-on Award helps you to make a smooth transfer to the Scout Troop when you are about 10½.

You can attend the Cub and Scout meetings for four to six weeks and take an active part in the Troop programme. During this time you will work for the Scout Membership Award.
